PFAS detected below federal limits

The EPA set enforceable limits for six PFAS compounds in April 2024. Grade reflects the worst single compound result.

Findings

What This Means

Summary Airway Heights' municipal water system earned a B grade, indicating that detected PFAS levels are below federal limits but that contamination is present in the water supply. No compounds were found above their respective EPA maximum contaminant levels. The most notable regulated compound detected, PFHxS, came in at 3.

What You Can Do

- Request your utility's full Consumer Confidence Report (CCR) for additional water quality data
- Consider an NSF 53 (pitcher) or NSF 58 (reverse osmosis) certified filter if PFAS were detected
- Attend your local water board or city council meeting to ask about treatment plans
